Funding to develop heritage tourism in the Kimberley region

Residents and tourists in the Kimberley region will learn more about the rich heritage that surrounds them, thanks to much needed funding from the Kimberley Community Foundation.

The Kimberley Community Foundation awarded not-for-profit organisation, Museums Australia WA a \$7,135 grant to develop and launch its new *Kimberley Museum and Heritage* brochure.

Kimberley Community Foundation spokesperson, Kelvin Barr said that the brochure will be an invaluable tool in increasing the number of visitors to the plentiful Kimberley attractions.

“The new brochure will certainly raise community and visitor awareness about our unique heritage and support the tourism industry, which is a great win for local community,” Mr Barr said.
